

CONNECTICUT ENVIROTHON GUIDELINES FOR ORAL PRESENTATIONS

Preparation

1. The oral presentation scenario will be determined by the Connecticut Envirothon Steering Committee based on the National Envirothon Current Issue of Year. The scenario will be released to the teams by email and available on the web site in March preceding the competition.
2. Each team's rotation schedule will be determined randomly at the start of the competition. No extra time will be allotted to any team that arrives late to the competition.

Materials

1. Each team may bring the following prepared materials
 - One standard size poster board, flip chart page or three-fold display board not to exceed 3' by 4'. Put your school name (small size) on the **back** of the poster. (These will be displayed after the testing.)
 - Two 4x6 note cards per student
2. Prepared materials, **both posters and cards**, must be submitted at check-in. They will be held in a secure area and given to the team before their presentation.
3. No electronic materials (Power Point etc.) may be used for the presentation.

Presentation

1. Presentations are to be a total of 14 minutes divided as follows:
 - 9-10 minutes for the actual presentation. Points will be deducted from the team score if the presentation is less than 9, or more than 10 minutes. Presentations continuing past 10 minutes will be required to stop after 11 minutes.
 - Judges may ask questions following the presentation, with questions and answer time ceasing 14 minutes after the beginning of the presentation.
2. Teams must wear the official Connecticut Envirothon T-shirt for the presentation in order to remain anonymous to the panel of judges. No articles with school identification such as hats, jackets, etc. will be permitted. Students should not be carrying bags. No electronic devices are allowed and no derogatory comments of any kind

will be tolerated. Each team member is expected to make a significant contribution to the presentation.

3. All possible efforts will be made to keep the testing area or room free of distractions.
4. Each presentation room will have a monitor/timekeeper who will notify the teams when there are 3 minutes and 1 minute remaining in their presentation time.
5. Each presentation room may also have a videographer who will record the presentations. Tapes will be made available to team advisors.
6. Only the team members, judges, monitor/timekeeper, videographer and a maximum of two committee members, sponsors, or members of the press will be allowed in the presentation room or area. No one will be permitted to enter or leave during the presentation.

Judging and Scoring

1. All judges must attend an orientation and training prior to the competition.
2. Prior to the competition, each judge will receive a packet of materials including general information about Envirothon, the Oral Presentation Guidelines and Scoring Rubric, and background information on the current issue topic.
3. A panel of three judges will be assigned to each presentation room.
4. Alternate judges will be on hand to fill any vacancies.
5. At least one of the three judges should be an expert in the current issue topic.
6. Judges will ask questions of the presenting team following the presentation.
7. These questions will be predetermined and relatively uniform for each team.
8. All judges will use the same scoring rubric.
9. The oral presentation will count for 100 points.
10. The scores of the judges will be averaged to obtain a final oral presentation score.
11. All decisions of the judges are final.
12. Any team violating the rules of the competition will be disqualified.

Wildcard Teams

Wildcard Teams will not have a prepared oral presentation. There will be an alternate activity related to the Current Issue for Wildcard Teams.
