It's time to begin another year with the Connecticut Envirothon Program! The Connecticut Envirothon Steering Committee is gearing up to provide another quality learning program for 2017-2018.

Utilizing electronic handouts and the hands-on workshops, Envirothon has been very successful at training students on each of our major components: forestry, aquatics, soils, and wildlife. We also cover a rotating current issue, which this year is focusing on Range/Wildlife Management. We sincerely hope that you find the curriculum materials provided on the website and at the workshops useful for classroom use as well for preparing your team for the Field Competition.

Each May, participation in Envirothon culminates with the Field Competition where the student teams rotate through five practical testing stations. While the student teams are competing, teachers attend an educational program focused on the next year's current issue. The Connecticut Envirothon program provides a great opportunity for students to interact with professionals in the environmental field during training workshops and the competition in May.
