

## 2021 Current Issue Presentation

Connecticut's 2020-2021 Current Issue theme is "Water Resource Awareness, Connections, and Impacts" and the problem scenario has just been released!

In lieu of having the usual oral presentation based on the current issue scenario, CT Envirothon is challenging teams to create a PowerPoint or Google Slide presentation.

We are allowing 12 content slides this year, and any images used must be static, with no animations or sound effects due to the final PowerPoint presentation needing to be saved and submitted as a PDF file. More information on what needs to be included can be found in the scenario documents.

These presentations should be developed as a group effort. Teams may use virtual meeting platforms such as ZOOM, WebEx, Google Hangout, or similar, to draft the responses and design the presentation as a group. These presentations will be due **Sunday May 16<sup>th</sup> at**11:59PM, however teams are strongly encouraged to submit their presentation when they feel like they are complete and ready for grading to ctenvirothon@gmail.com. These submissions will be graded by our panel of judges and receive a score, based on the provided rubric, which will be combined with the written Station Tests and added to your team's total. Your presentation will remain anonymous throughout the scoring process so please **do not include** your team/school name on your presentation slides.
